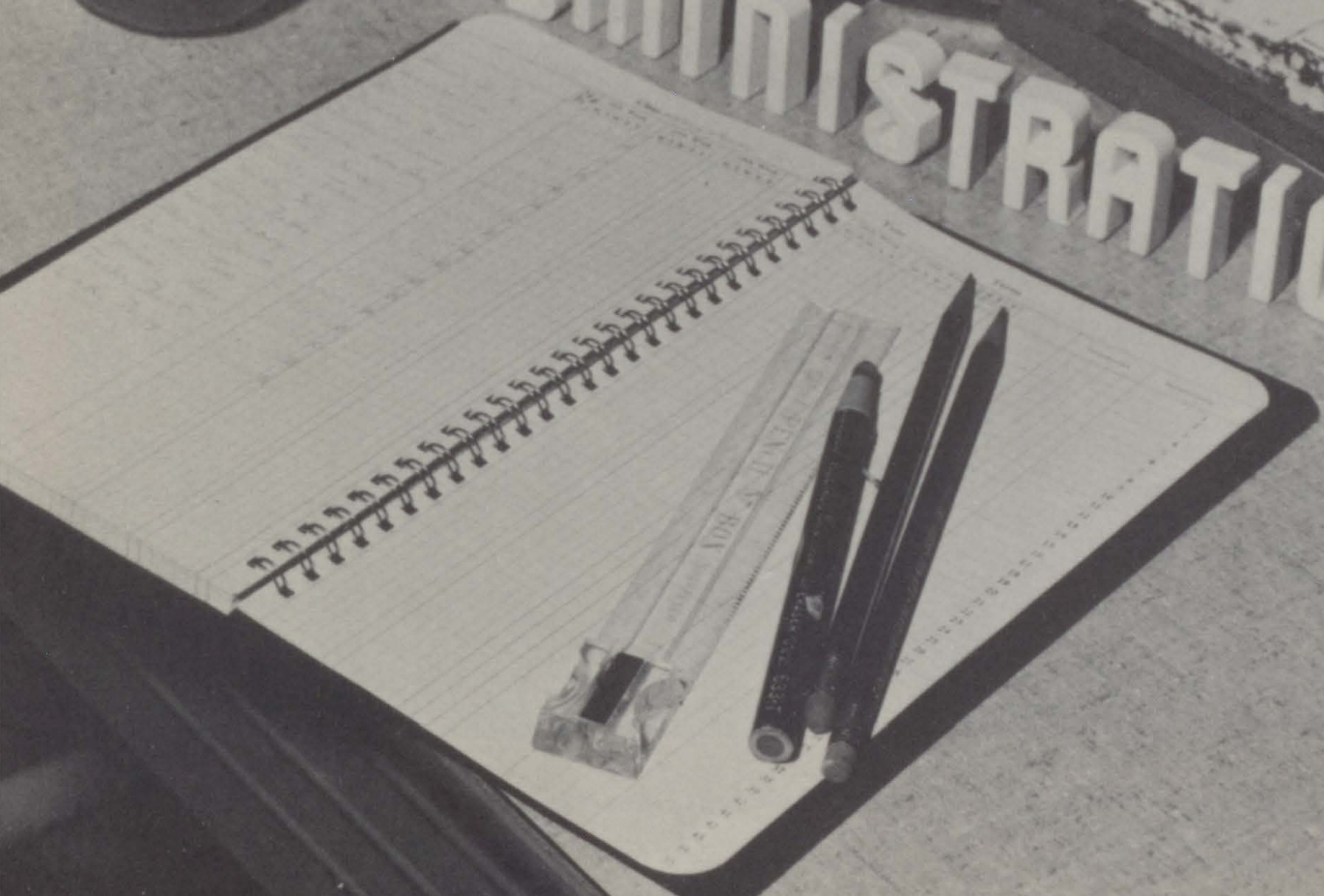
Appreciation

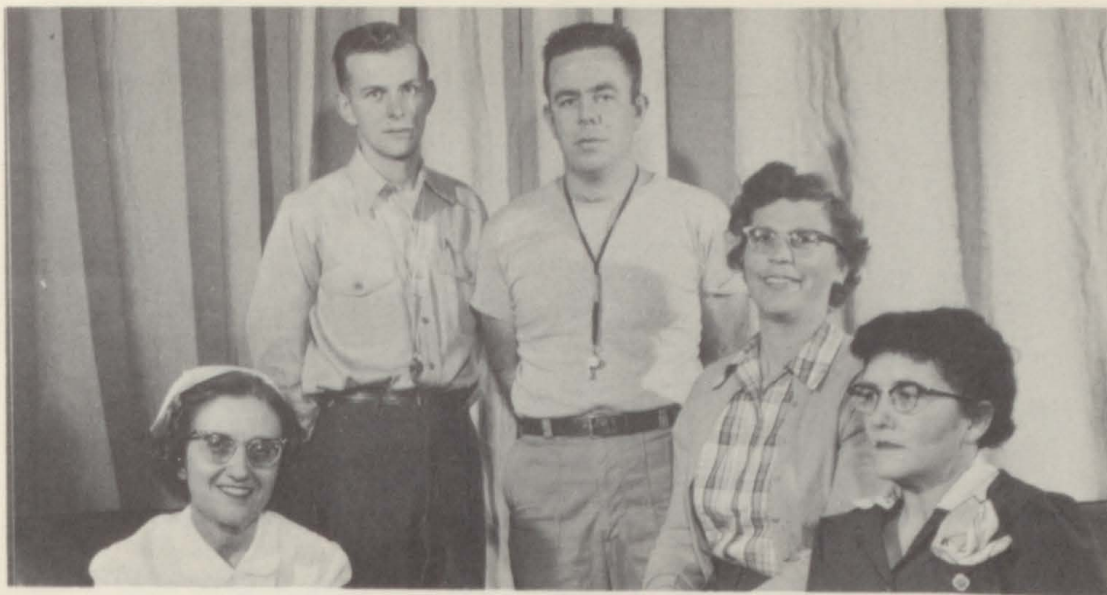
