








So What's the Theme?





Overall, the soccer season was full of fun and laughs despite our losing record.













Our prom was held in the gym on May 13, 1989. Our theme was "Hold on to the Night" and our music was provided by J.P.L. Productions.


Honey Wilson was crowned the queen with Sandy Schwasnick and Val Nero crowned first and second princesses.

I have really had a GREAT time here, thanks to all of you. It was hard in the beginning to adjust to the American way of living, but you all made me feel good.






