I've been really busy here for the last seven months. I attend a school from 8:20 until 2:55 every day. Two nights a week I train for volleyball, and we play games on the weekends. I also regularly attend Rotary meetings. All this is combined with a fabulous social life. Weekends here are filled with parties. They begin around 8 PM on Saturday and around 10 or 11 we go to one of Harstad's three discos. The discos close at 3:30 AM and it's typical to go to another house party after that; so to come in around 7 AM is a habit for some.

The parental guidance is a lot different here. It's expected that you will go out and if you don't you start to get weird looks. You're treated more like an adult here. What you choose to do is your choice. It's great!

Being an exchange student is an excellent opportunity for so many reasons. You leam so much more than the obvious - by obvious I mean language culture. You leam to depend on yourself and to get along with everyone. That's probably the most important of all. I haven't met a Norwegian I couldn't like.

This year abroad has been great and is a time of my life that I'll never forget. So far there are only about 2000 people who are coming to Oxford to visit. (I hope they all don't come at oncel)

To qualify for an Academic " 0 " a student must earn an 85 average for the year. The students who earn this award must take at least five subjects, fail none of them and receive no incompletes. They also cannot drop a course.
The grades in the courses included in the figuring of the average usually count for the face value of the grade. The exceptions are: gym, which is not counted; band, in which $75 \%$ of the grade counts; and science with a lab, which counts 1.5 times the actual grade.

On the opening day of school, the Academic " 0 " awards are given out during the first assembly of the school year.
