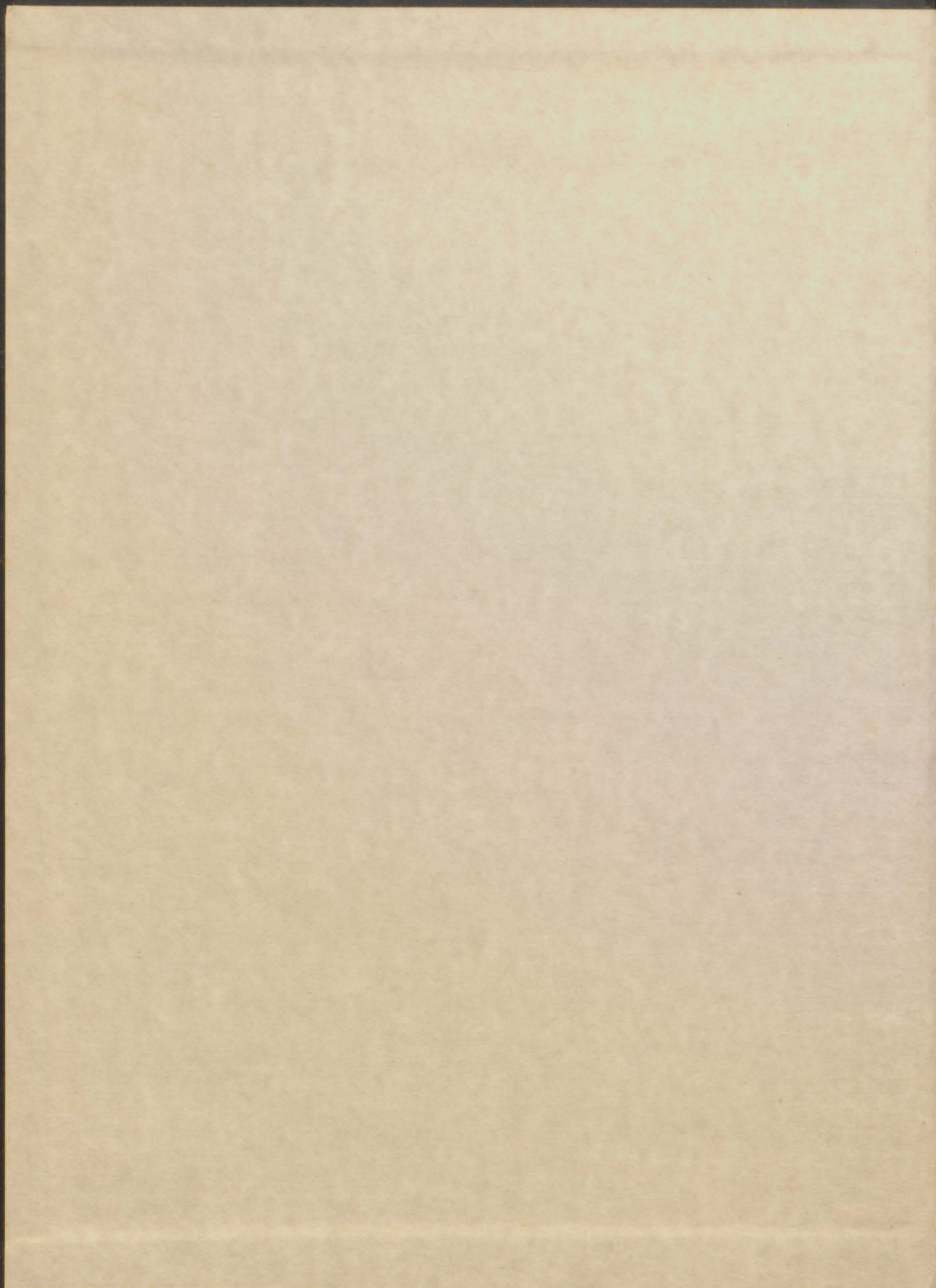
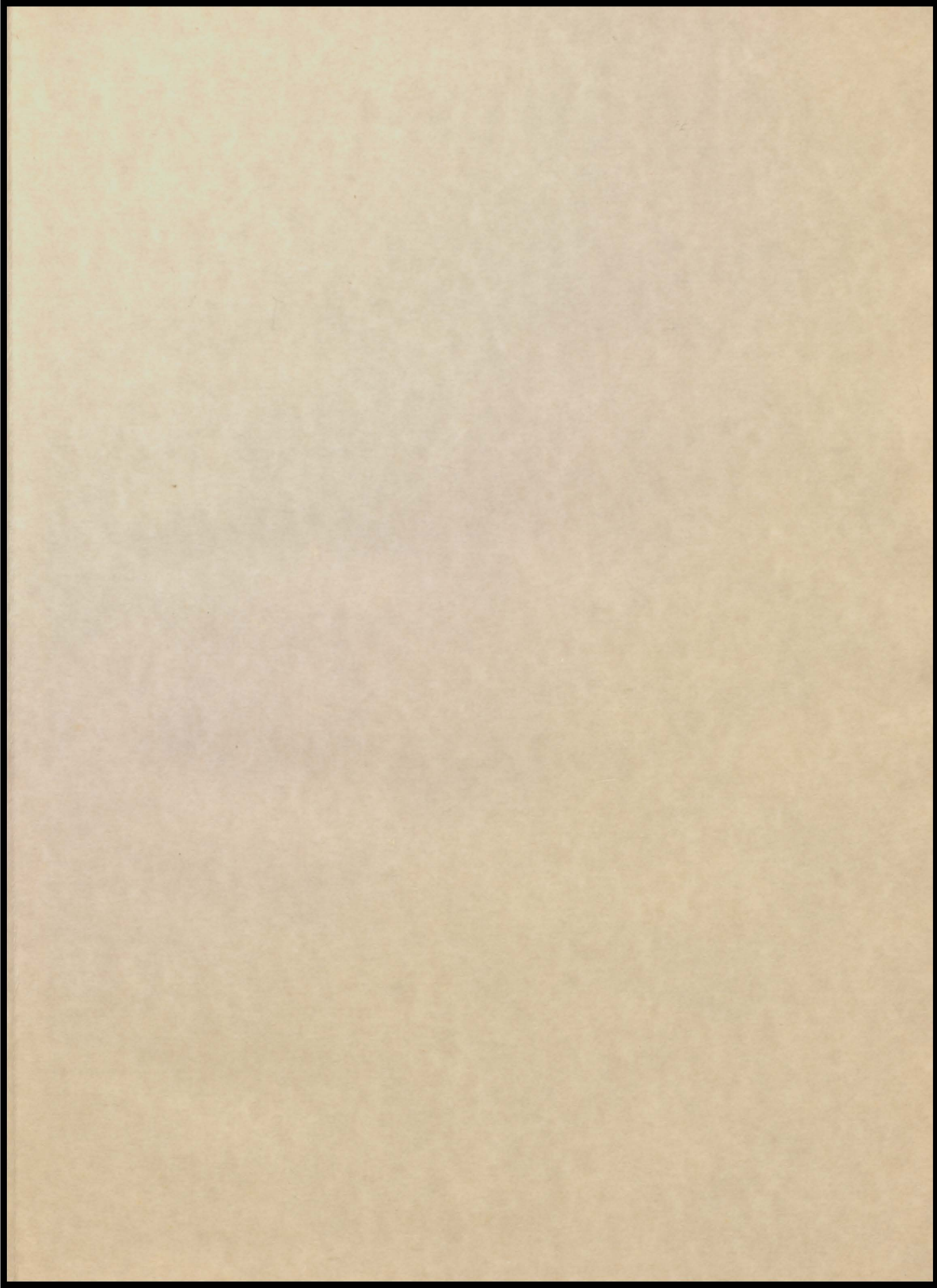


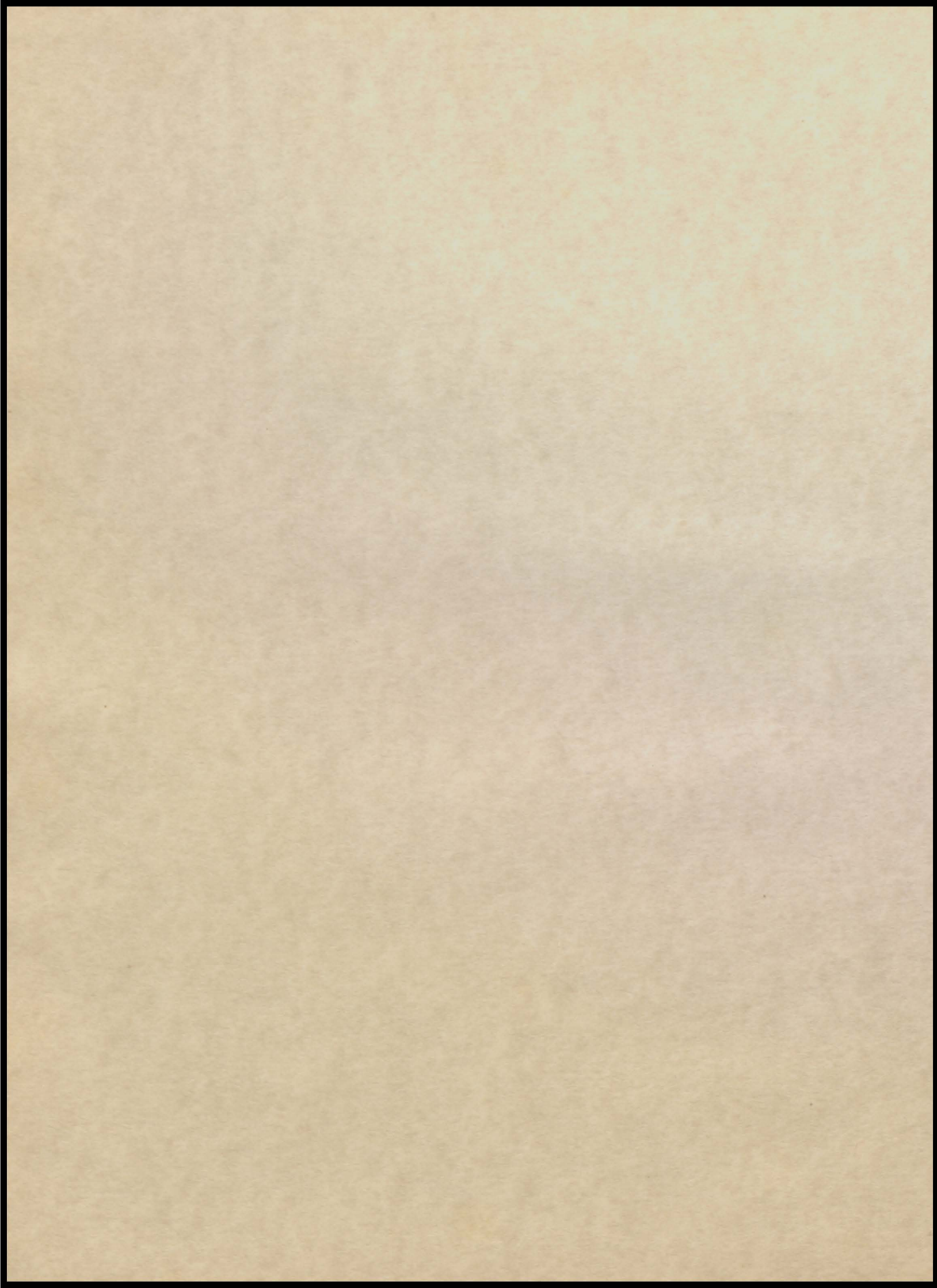

The 6th Oxford Academy building opened in 1897. This red brick structure was demolished to be replaced by the present middle school as the district's population grew.

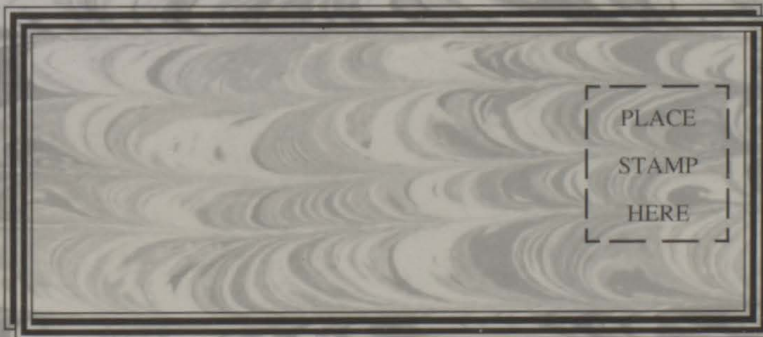
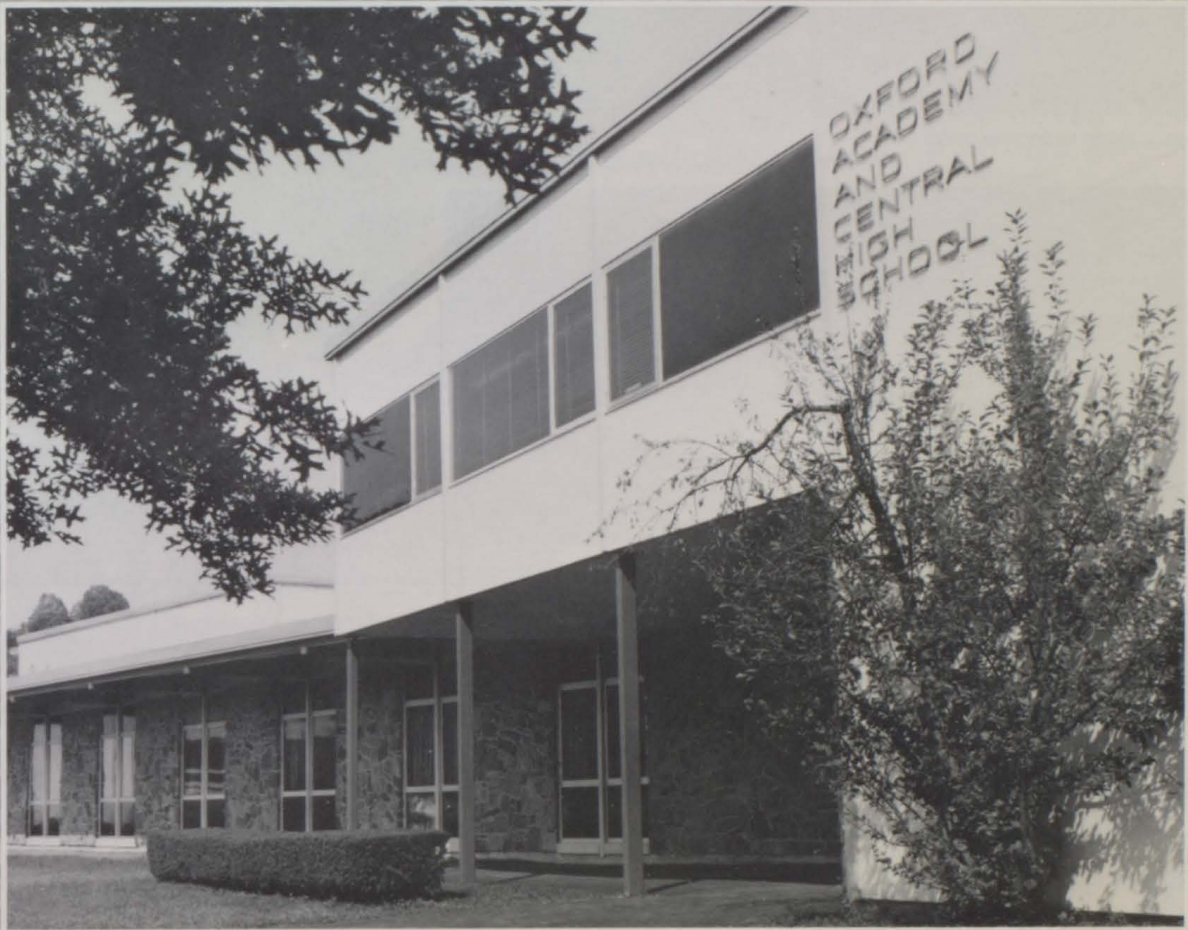

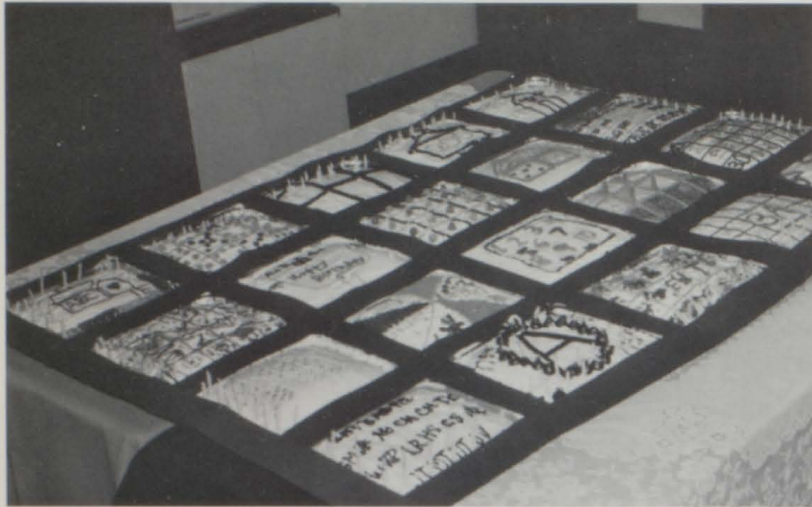

The History of Our Academy

Today we celebrate the 200th anniversary of our Academy. This institution was constructed in 1793, three years after the Town of Oxford was founded. The legal title "The Trustees of Oxford Academy," was granted on this day in 1794. This charter was one of four given in the state, west of the Hudson River.

For the first one hundred years, Oxford Academy was a private institution. It later merged into a free school system of the state and was designated Oxford Academy and Union School.

The first Academy building was sold for 8 British pounds, and the sixth Academy cost \$20,000 to build. In 1930 a new school, the seventh Academy, was constructed. It is a very attractive building of red brick with white pillars in the front. It is today what we call the Middle School.

In 1962 ground was broken for a second school in the district. This school would be a 600 pupil Junior and Senior High School. That building is the one you and I are in today.

In 1972 the third school of the expanding district was built next to the new High School. These three schools are standing and functional today.

Oxford Academy has had 200 years of excellence. It has graduated a New York State Governor, a United States Supreme Court Justice, a United States Post Master General, and a Superior Court Judge, not to mention the doctors, lawyers, educators, and skilled workers that this Academy has helped prepare for society.

It is our past that inspires the present, and it is the present that prepares us for the future, a future of 200 more years of learning, and friends at Oxford Academy.

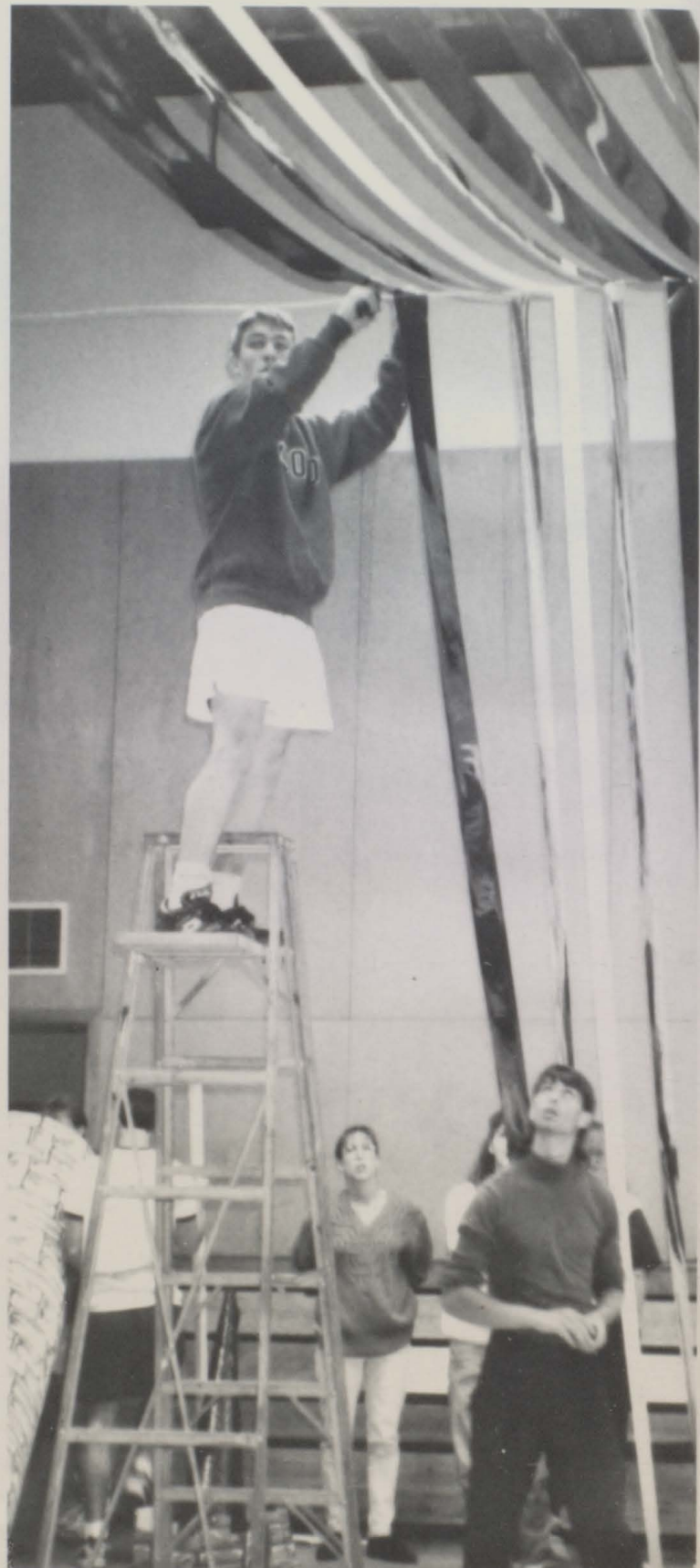

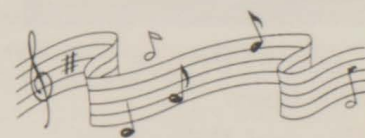

Chers tout le monde (yeah, that means everybody),

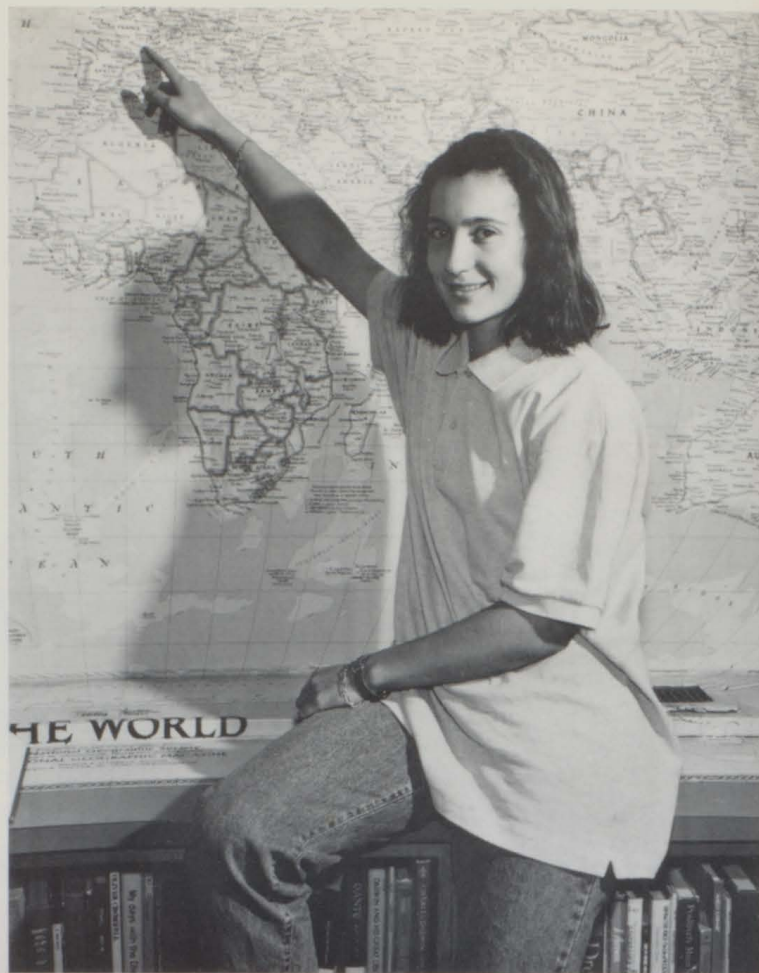

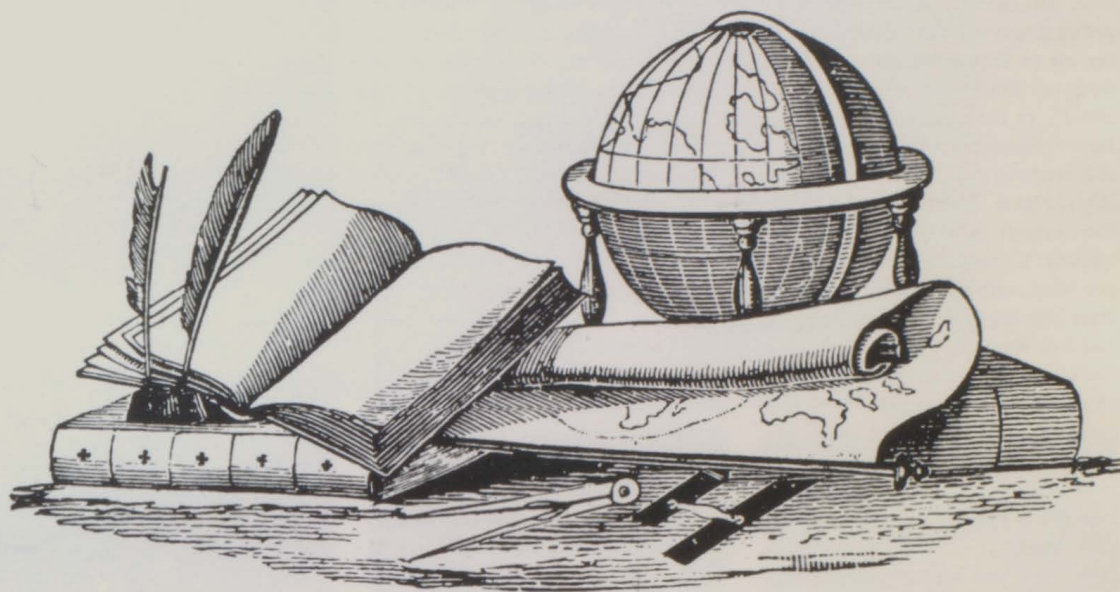

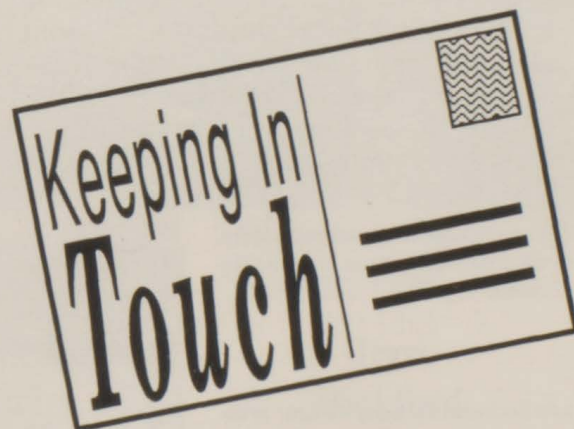
From France to Mexico

High Schoolers with jobs

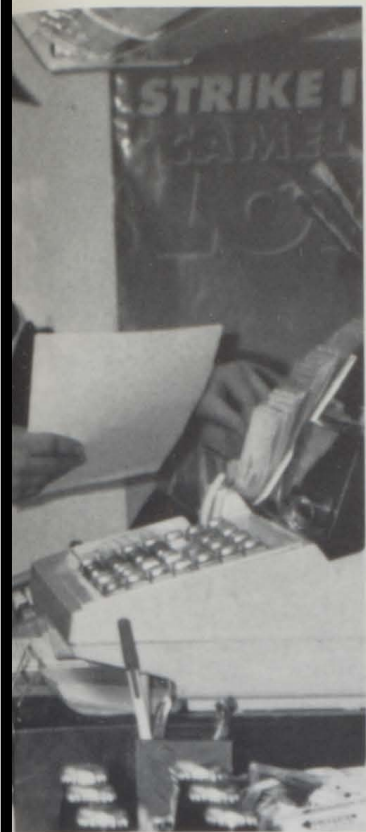

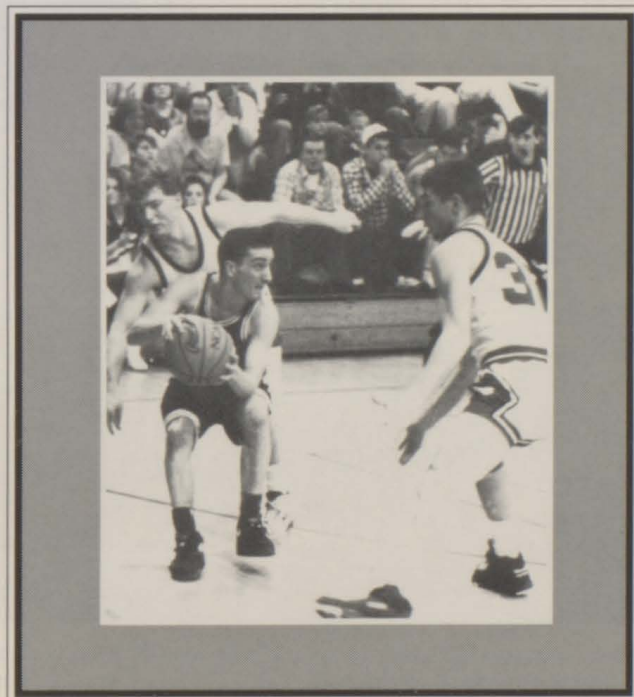

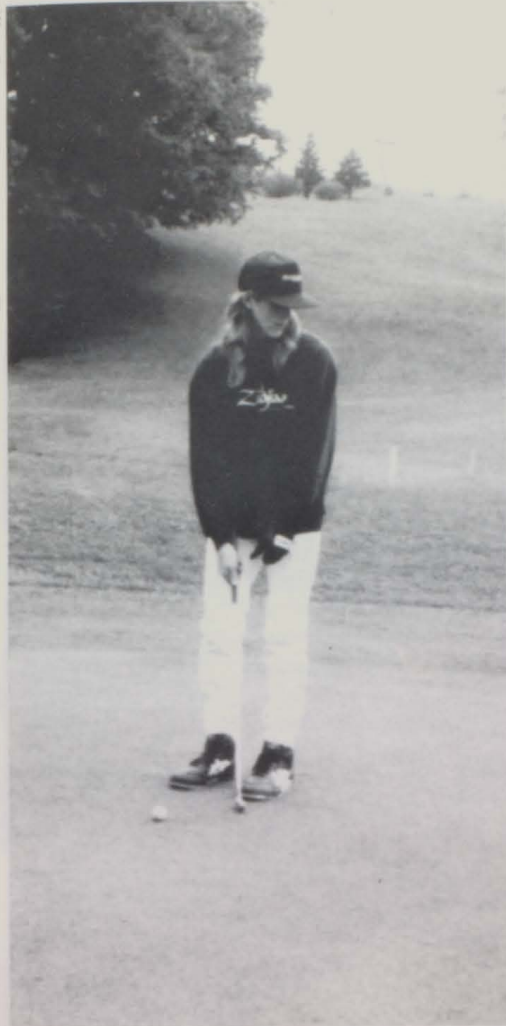

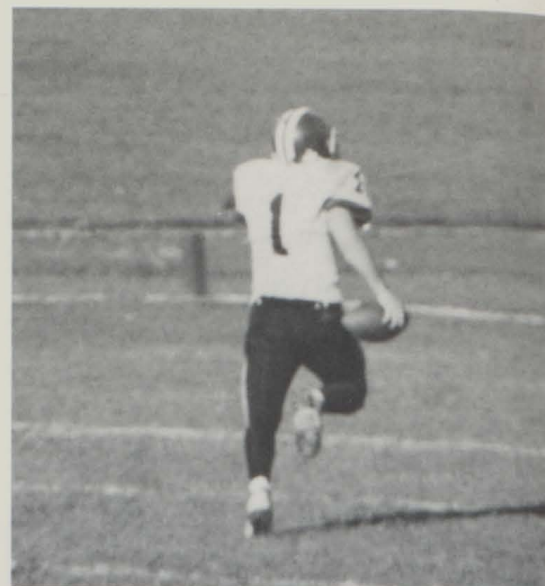

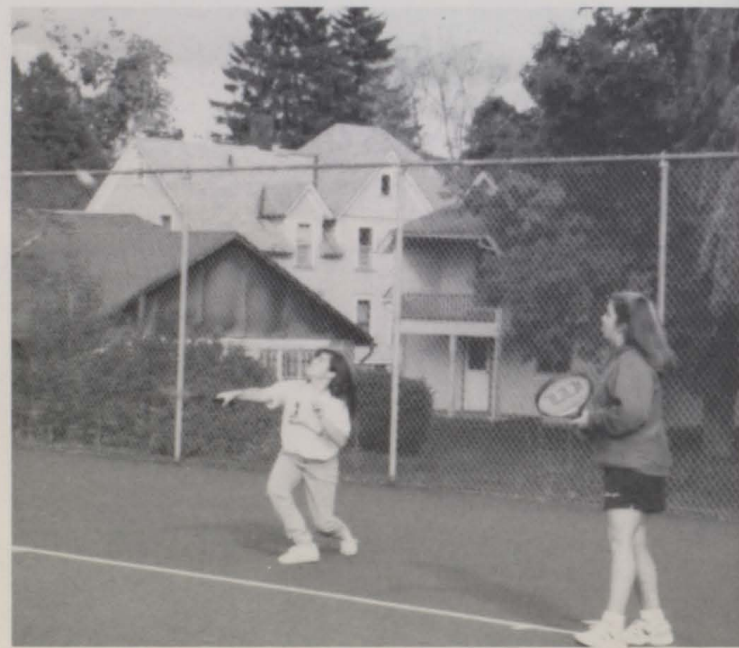

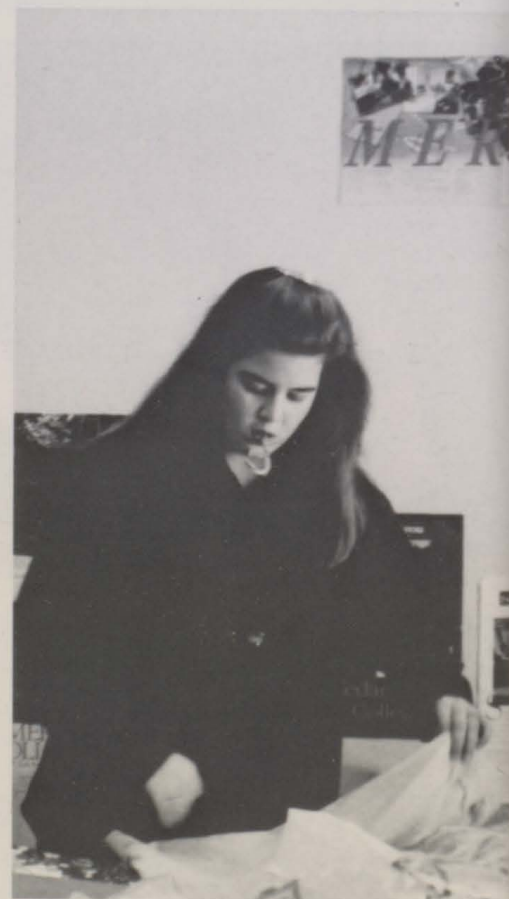

Mock Trial Record 1-1

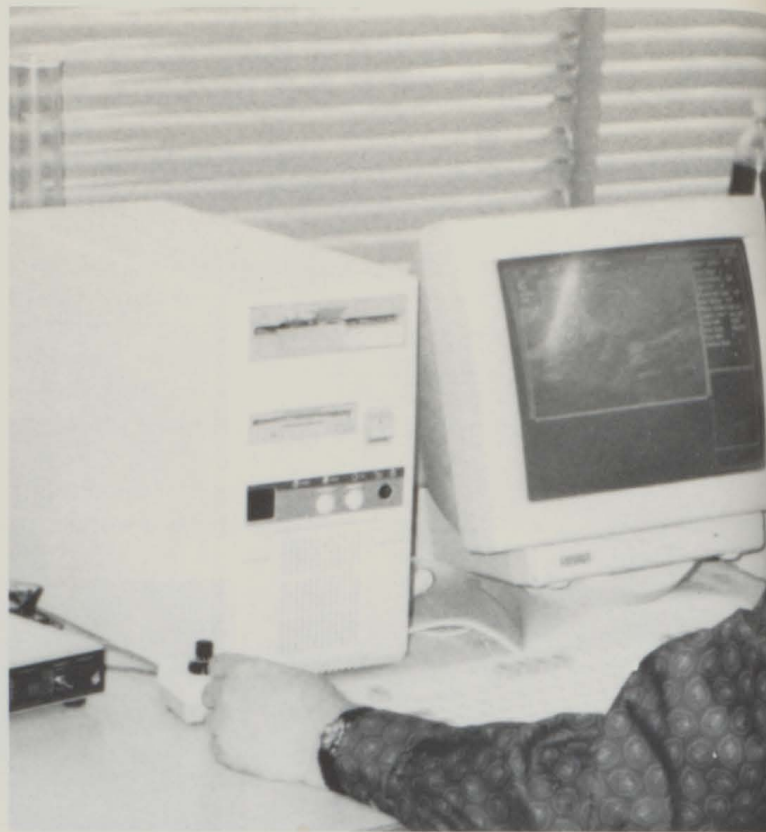
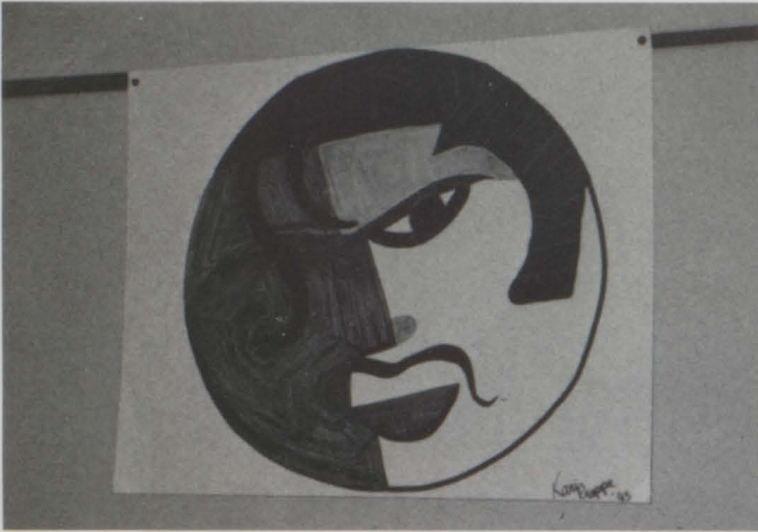

New Opportunities for Oxford Students

We have started a new program called Tech Prep. This program will beef up educational opportunities for students who are going into the work force or to a two-year college after graduation.

Courses at the high school will be added. Some of the new classes will be Bio/Chem Technology, using applications in science along with Principals of Technology, which uses principals of physics with applications to technology; Applied Communication, which will teach skills in human and electronic communications; and Introduction

to Occupations will be beefed up, with more speakers coming into the classes to describe their jobs.

The foundation of the program will begin in the Middle School. Students will "shadow" people in business, learning about various professions in the community. Students will also have the opportunity to take part in on-the-job training, mentoring, and apprenticeships. These opportunities will give Oxford students better chances for success in the workplace and in technical colleges.

Oxford Satellite Scans Weather

The Earth Science classes have a new resource for weather study. The weather satellite was acquired by the school last year using money from federal and state grants. The computer used in conjunction with the satellite is equivalent to an IBM 486. It is equipped with a color Desk Jet printer 5506, a satellite frequency scanner, a satel-

lite dish, and a helix antenna (the latter two are located on the roof of the school).

Two main satellites are used: one American, called Tiros, a polar satellite whose signals are received on the helix antenna; and one French, called Meteor, a three-satellite system whose information is received by the satellite dish

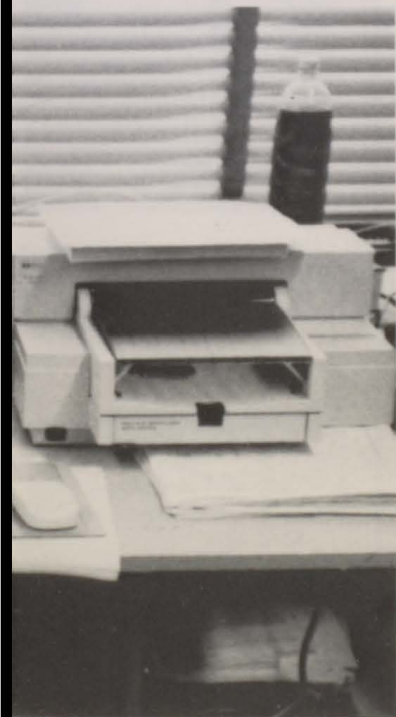

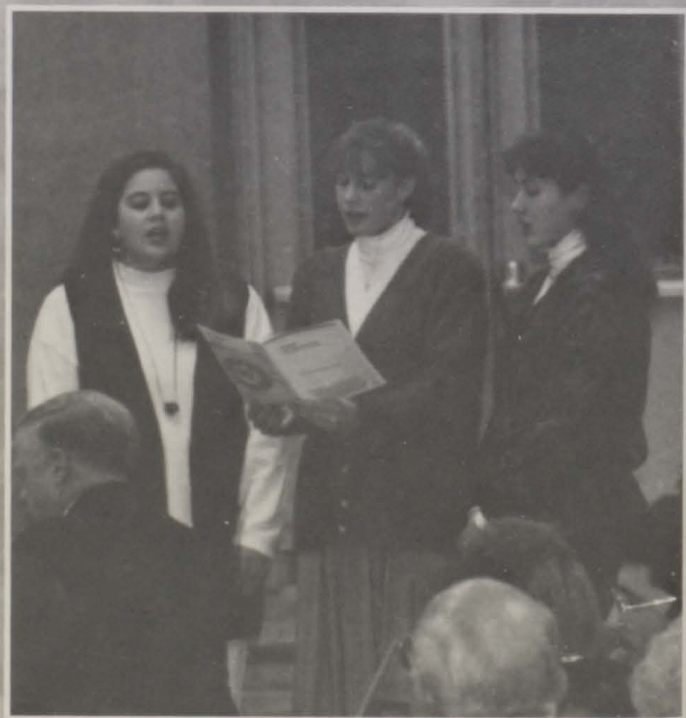

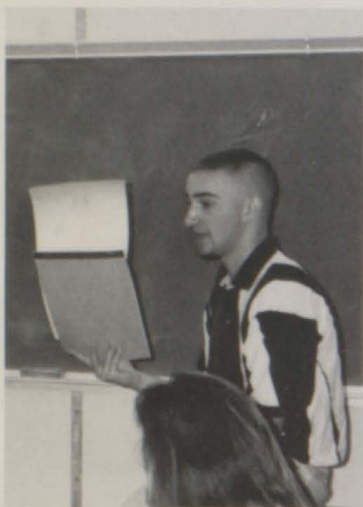

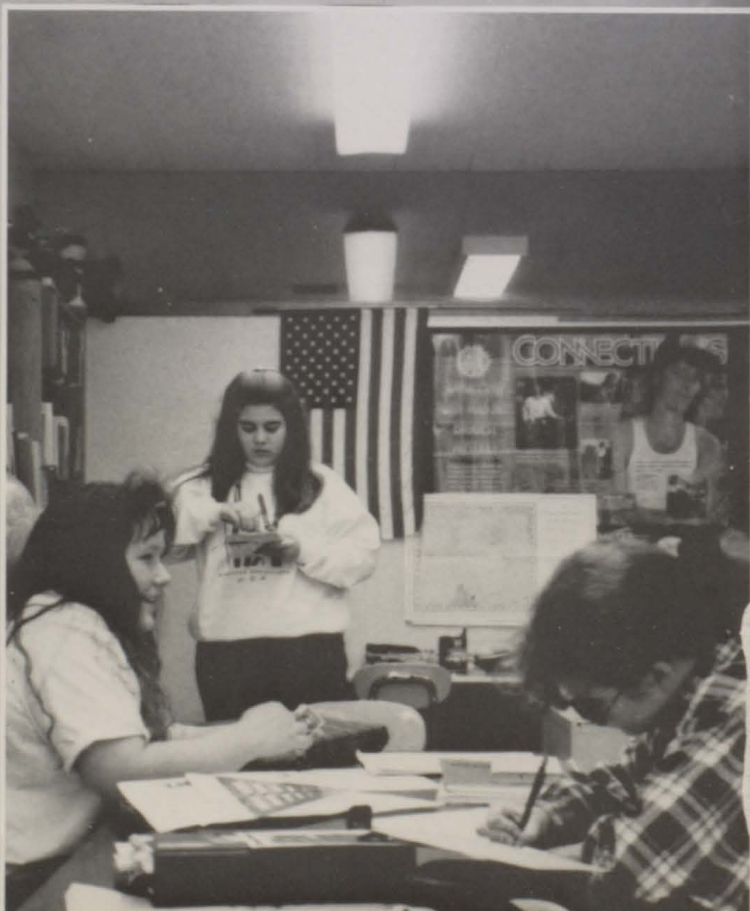


Deadlines keep yearbook staffers on their toes

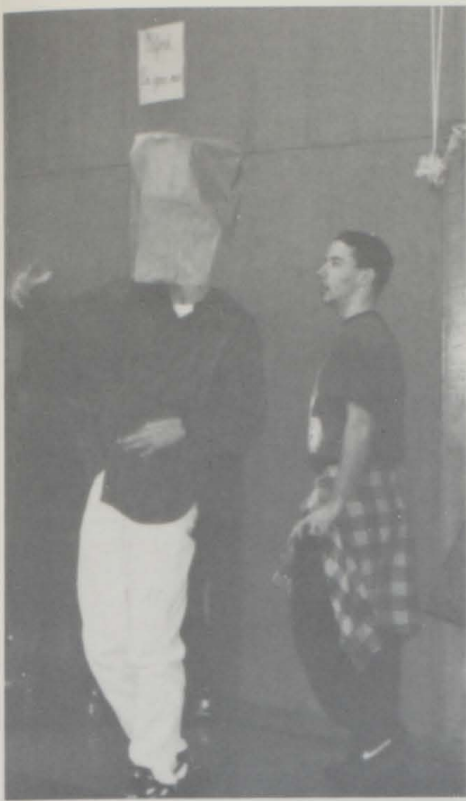
