The peer mediation program is designed to help students solve their differences in constructive ways. Through the use of peer mediation, conflicts can be resolved without the use of an adult authority figure.

Most recently, fourteen students have been trained as peer mediators. They must remain completely neutral and keep the sessions confidential. Mediation is a voluntary process where the goal is to produce an agreement that will help the students resolve their conflicts.

Students may be referred for mediation by a teacher, staff member, another student or themselves. Two peer mediators will meet with those involved in the conflict and help to guide them in finding their own resolution to their problems.
