




Peer Mediation is a student-centered program with the sole purpose of helping students resolve conflict in a non-violent manner. Student peer mediators have participated in a training program that teaches them skills needed to help students resolve conflicts. Through a process called "mediation", the mediators help fellow students resolve conflicts before they progress into bigger issues.

The process of peer mediation begins with a referral. Teachers, students, or the principal may refer students in conflict for mediation. If the students in conflict agree to mediate, the peer mediators step in to guide the process. The task of the mediators is to help the disputants discover the source of the problem and develop a plan or agreement to resolve the conflict.

Peer mediation requires time and commitment on the part of the mediators. Their efforts are greatly appreciated.










A season to remember


For the last three years I have competed in the American Legion Oratorical Contest. This year I advanced all the way



A New Math Program and New Challenges

The high school math department will be implementing a lot of changes beginning in September 2001. The traditional Course I, II and III sequence will phase out over three years as we introduce the new Math A and Math B curricula...along with new textbooks, new Regents exams and new requirements for graduation!


Freshmen entering next year will be required to earn a minimum of 3 math credits as opposed to the 2 credits currently required. They must also take the Math A exam and pass with a 65 or better; the transitional 55 will no longer be in effect for the Class of 2005 and beyond.

Students who then successfully complete the coursework and exam for Math B will recieve an Advanced Designation on their diploma. Another major change at the Math B level will be the inclusion of graphing calculators--a requirement for the Math B exam.

The math content will remain basically the same-algebra, geometry and trigonometry. However, it will be packaged very differently and will require different teaching stategies to better match the new State assessments. Students will need additional practice responding to open-ended questions and communicating mathematically. Justine looks like she is working hard in Earth science.

AIDS reaches epidemic proportions in southern Africa. Leaders and citizens throughout the world conduct a massive educational campaign on World AIDS Day December 1 to teach people about the disease that is killing 6,000 sub-Saharan Africans each day.

Uganda is struck by an occurrence of the deadly Ebola virus that is linked to more than 100 deaths. The outbreak is traced to a Gulu woman who died in September and whose body infected other people during the ritual cleansing of the dead.



A In January 2001, a 7.9 magnitude earthquake devastates Gujarat in western India. The huge quake causes an estimated \$5.5 billion in damages and kills more than 20,000 people.



A In August, Somalia elects its first president in nine years. President Abdiqasim Salad Hassan promises to bring peace and economic recovery to the African nation.



A Former Coca-Cola executive Vicente Fox, of the National Action Party, is elected president of Mexico in July, ending the Institutional Revolutionary Party's 71-year reign.
