## Town of Oxford <br> by Ms. Melissa Smith

Before the American Revolutionary War, and for hundreds of years, the Iroquois Confederacy, made up of the Mohawk, Oneida, Onondaga, Cayuga, Seneca and later the Tuscarora, lived in New York State.
On September 22, 1788, at the site of Fort Schuyler in Utica, the Oneida Indians, the Nation living on the land that present day Oxford sits upon, signed a treaty with New York State Governor George Clinton. This treaty ceded the area known as the "Chenango Twenty Towns" to The New York State Government and it was opened to Colonial Settlers.

In 1791, Benjamin Hovey moved his family from Oxford, Massachusetts to our area, and built a log cabin. Twelve more families arrived this same year, all with different interests and needed skills. Benjamin Hovey was a General in the Revolutionary War and hecame successful in business with "friends in many high places" including NYS Governor, George Clinton. He became known in our area as "the Father of the Settement." In 1793 areas known as Fayette, Gore, Union and Jericho were incorporated into the Town of Oxford.
The first Town Meeting was held in General Howey's home in April of 1794. He became the First Town Supervisor and named Oxford after his hometown. He was also instrumental in the forming of The Oxford Academy, and served on the Board of Trustees of Oxford Academy for 10 years.

## The Oxford Academy and Central School History <br> by Kesple Hioul Ms. Joni Ention and Mr. Fred Lemfear

"No institution in Oxford has affected more people, been of more public concern, or created more loyalty in our town, than the Oxford Academy."

The education of Oxford's youth began in the mid 1700's, when Philip and Betsy Bartle opened their home on Panther Hill (Painter Hill) to those who wanted to learn.

In 1792 General Hovey and David Bates gave an acre of land on the Northeastern side of Washington Park to Osford, for the purpose of building an Academy building. This became the first frame building raised in town. With only a few families in Oxford, Yale graduate, Uri Tracy was the first teacher and principal. The Academy was two stories high and was a Private Classical Boarding School for young men only.

On January 12, 1793, the Trustees of Oxford Academy petitioned the NYS Regents for a Charter. On January 27,1794,

Osford Academy received is Charter with the legal title of "The Trustees of Oxford Academy" and was signed by Governor George Clinton. This Charter hangs today in the front entrance way of the Oxford Academy Middle School.

During that time, the Academy was one of only four Charter Schools west of the Hudson River. The Oxford Academy attracted students not only from Oxford, but also surrounding counties. As its reputation grew it also attracted students from nearby states, such as Ohio, Indiana, and Kentucky.

In Autumn of 1799 a second building was erected near the site of the present Episcopal rectory but it was destroyed by fire and never occupied. A third building was erected on this site in 1806, until it was moved to the corner of Greene and Merchant Streets. This school was used until 1831 and was then sold to the Trustees of The Methodist Church.

In 1832 a fourth Academy was erected on the Easterly side of Fort Hill and the School was now opened to girls. A separate Boarding House was built for them.

In 1854 New York State Regents examinations began and a fifth Academy was dedicated on August first of that same year. This building was located at the Southern end of Fort Hill, and was the last building erected by the Trustees of Oxford Aeademy. Their vision held true that with the construction of the schools, Oxford was expected to prosper and high standards were meant to be met.

These first Five buildings were Private Institutions and the students who attended were required to pay a tuition. Many students opted for a Classical curricilum, which included Latin, French, Mathematics, Astronomy, Geography, History, Literature and Rhetoric. The Oxford Academy's extensive curriculum adequately prepared its students for college.

In 1895 Districts One and Two were combined into a Union School District. This became a Public School under the name of Oxford Academy and Union School and the sixth school was officially opened in 1897. Due to inadequate conditions of this building, On December 12, 1929 a plan for a new building was submitted bo the voters of Oxford.

In that same year, Centralization in New York added pelve districts, and "Oxford Academy and Union School" became "Ovford Academy and Central School."

In 1930 the vote was passed, and the seventh school was built, which is our present day Middle School Building. Because of over crowding, an addition was added parallel with the river in 1953.

In the Summer of 1963 the first High School of Oxford Academy and Central School was built on the West side of South Washington Avenue, making this the eighth building of Oxford Academy History. Near this school, a Primary School was built and opened in 1973.

In 2004 the present High School was built and is connected to the Primary School. The former High School was razed, and parking and athletic fields now take its place.

In 2014 we have 3 separate school buildings in our District, all aligned to the same purpose and "Focused on Learning." Our Mission Statement is "To develop self-directed learners who are able to make intelligent choices and contribute to society." One Student at a Time.

For three centuries, the Oxford Academy has continued its school pride and lifelong traditions.


## The Tuscarora Native Americans Move to Oxford <br> by Ms Joni Eaton

Long before White men and women ever arrived on our continent, Native Americans lived in New York Here flourished the great Iroquois Confederacy which was made up of 5 separate Indian Nations. These were the Mohawk, Oneida, Onondaga, Cayuga and Seneca Nations.

At this time the Tuscarora Indian Nation thrived in the North Carolina, but were driven north by white settiers. They arrived in our area and setted in this place we call Oxford. They buile a fort where the Fire Station stands now. Human bones, ancient earthen cooking utensils and other relics were found there, while exdavations were made to create trenching for the village system of water works in 1897.

The vantage point of this fort was perfect, built out on a mound of land from which one could see up and down the Chenango River. The fort was semi-circular in form and its curved sides were encircled by a well defined ditch about four feet in depth. It must have been a formidable place against the bow and arrow and war club.

The Tuscaroran chief connected to this particular fort was named "Thick Neck" and he was a deadly foe to the Oneida Indians, who resided north of them.

Whenever the Oneidas came into this vicinity, Thick Neek destroyed them. The Oneidas attempted to lure Thick Neck out of his stronghold many times and finally succeeded in getting between him and his fort.

It was then that Thick Neck quickly turned and ran down the Chenango River to Warn Pond where he hid in the marsh. He was soon discovered and was unable to combat with the enemy and was killed. The Oneidas buried him on the bank of the pond.

Thick Neck's tribe, the Tuscaroras, were adopted by the Oneidas, thus becoming the 6th Nation of the Iroquois Confederacy and forever removing the permanent Native Americans from the Oxford area.

The Chenango River

The name "Chenango" was given to the river by the Oneida Native Americans and means "Land of the Bull Thistle."

The river has been used for transportation, food and other resources.

Plans for the Washington Park Gazebo were drawn by D.L. Sherwood. On April 21, 1875 the proposed plans were presented to the Village of Oxford at a construction cost of $\$ 80$ and was built.

The Gazebo was restored in 1991 by The Oxford Historical Society and The Oxford Revitalization Project.

This nostalgic and historic Oxford icon continues to be where our townsfolk go for photographs of proms, weddings and dances.

## The Rail Era in Oxford by Lea Davis, Fred Lanfear \& Ms. Eaton

 As the use of the Chenango Oanal declined in the 1870 s, it was gradually replaced by two railroads, The Ontario \&e Western ( O \&W) and The Delaware, Lackawanna \&e Western (DL\&EW.) These became Oxford's primary method of shipping and transportation. The beginning of this new era in Oxford, crossing Lyon Brook Bridge on December 23, 1869. The first passenger trains began stopping in Oxford on February 21, 1870, connecting Oxford to Oswego. Train travel continued to grow well into the 1900 s , with passenger and freight trains stopping at the Depot (now the Oxford Historical Society Building) essentially 24 hours a day. Four trains ran north to Utica with the cost of 90 cents one way and four trains ran towards Binghamton for 70 cents one way. Besides making eross-country travel an option for Oxford residents, the railroad also gave a boost to the town's Bluestone production, with specially designed railroad cars making it much easier to sip slabs of bluestone to customers. Bluestone buyers during the railroad era included the Vanderbilts in New York City, who paved their sidewalks with our Oxford Bluestone

The Great Era of The Chenango Canal

The Chenango Canal was built entirely by the hands of many men in 1837. The 97 mile canal stretched from Utica and connected to the Erie Canal in the North, to Binghamton in the South.

## A look back through time



Special flat bottomed Canal Boats, called "Packet Boats" were hauled by a team of two mules or horses which traveled along a tow path, driven by a canaller. Travel moved at an average speed of 4 miles an hour. To surpass this speed would result in a ticket.

Passengers and goods were transported along the canal for almost 40 years. Oxford became one of the canal's most important local ports because of its many factories, bluestone quarries, lodging, restaurants, and storage buildings.

Besides bringing jobs and visitors to Oxford, people living in the village often played in the canal waters. In the summers people swam and fished in the canal, and ice skated and held horse races on the frozen water in the winter months.

After the arrival of two major railroad companies in Oxford, canal operators found it hard to compete with the transportation of goods and passengers. Thus The Chenango Canal began to decline until it was finally forced to close in 1878.

Modern day Route 12 literally was built upon the original Chenango Canal bed, and runs exactly how it flowed through the middle of Oxford.

For nearly 20 years, Hoppie's has been a staple in the Oxford Community. Situated right in the heart of town, this establishment provides young and old alike with a true 1950 's ice cream parlor experience.

The original Hoppie's was a confectionary shop, opened by Howard "Hoppie" Hoffman in another location in the village and moved several times.

Born in Oxford in $1889, \mathrm{Mr}$. Hoffman was well liked by everyone and had an array of business adventures besides his shop, and provided much community service to Oxford.
He was a farmer, had a grocery and poultry business, and created the Hoffman Inn out of the original residence of F. G. Clarke. This provided Oxford with one of the finest Hotels in the community's history. Still standing, today it is an Apartment building.

Mr. Hoffman served as the Village Town Clerk, was President of the Chamber of Commerce, served on the Board of Directors of Back River Cemetery, the School Board, was Assistant Chief of the Oxford Fire Department, was a Rotary Club Charter member, a member of the Citizen's Club, a member of the First Congregational Church and was at one time Mayor of Oxford!

Local businessman and Oxford alumna, David Emerson, knew Mr. Hoffman when he was a child, so when he and his wife, MaryEl, opened their corner restaurant in 1995, they named it Hoppie's in Mr. Hoffman's honor.

They furnished the shop with true 1950's equipment to provide authenticity.
The shop was later sold to Courtney Emerson who continued the tradition.
Hoppie's is currently owned by Oxford alumna, Danielle Williamson, who took over the establishment in 2006. Danielle has made many changes to the menu and the restaurant is now open year round, serving the community and attracting many tourists to our area.

## Peer Mediation

Peer Mediation is a program that facilitates students as mediators rather than an adult authority figure, to solve conflicts that occur between students. Student volunteers are specially trained to assist those who are referred to Peer Mediation and must remain neutral throughout the process as well as maintain complete confidentiality. The goal is to produce an agreement between the parties involved to solve their conflict.

Students can be referred by a teacher, staff member, other students, or themselves. During the process, two peer mediators meet with the parties involved and help them come to a resolution.

Types of problems peer mediators can help with include:

> - Social media improprieties
> - Relationship difficulties/harassment
> - Rumor and gossip
> - Cheating and stealing
> - Racial and cultural confrontations
> - Vandalism

# Our town 

The Oxford Fire Department By Fred Lanfear, Alicia Miller \& Ms. Eaton

The first really big fire in Oxford was caused by unstoppable flames that devoured the new school, before it was ever used. It happened on a September night in 1799. That night there was no organization, no equipment, and no water supply.

A few years later in 1810 a Fire Company was formed with little equipment. The method of getting water to a fire consisted of leather buckets filled with river water and passed from one person to another.

The Oxford Fire Department was started in July of 1823 and began with 21 Firemen. In April of $1824 \$ 50.00$ was appropriated to build a firehouse on Fort Hill. In April of 1845 a Hand Engine was purchased and in 1855 the Niagara Fire Company No. 1 was formed with 50 men.

With so many men joining the Fire Department, in April of 1859 the company was divided, and the two companies that formed were Niagara Company No. 1, which had 27 members, and Niagara Company No. 2 with 44 members.

Through the years came the formation of many fire companies and a new buttding:
1859 : The Lady Washington Hose Company 1867: New building purchased for $\$ 1,500.00$

1873 : Sappho Hose and Engine Company (later to become The Steamer Company) 1878 : The Hook and Ladder Company 1887: The Niagara Hose Company
1889 : The Lady Washington Hose Company was disbanded. 1898: The Independent Hose Company

The fire companies all shared the Fort Hill Building. In 1920 the first motor powered apparatus was purchased, which drastically cut the time to answer fire atarms.

Throughout the years many new trucks were purchased and the years of 1966 through 1968 saw the reorganization of the many Oxford fire departments.

During this time, and with the approval of the Village Board, the four existing companies, Niagara, Sappho, Independent, and Hook and Ladder, dissolved their corporations and merged into one department. At the annual meeting on April 4 , 1968, the department became known as The Oxford Fire Department, Inc.

Today The Oxford Fire Department is housed in a modern station, with five engines, pumpers, a rescue vehicle, and high ladder truck. The all volunteer crew are highly trained and have a four minute response time. It has equipment and material to combat any type of fire in the Oxford district and nearby communities.

The Fire Department has two ambulances staffed with emergency medical technicians, a river rescue boat, and a jaws of life for automobile and small space rescues.

The Oxford Fire Department is one of the most respected organizations in Oxford.


## Oxford Bluestone is Nationally Known

By Cheyene Moore, Mr. Fred Lanfear \& Ms. Eaton The "Bluestone Belt", which ran along the west bank of the Hudson River, southwest just past Pennsylvania, seemed to have inexhaustible deposits in Oxford.
Oxford was fortunate to have many quarries in the 1800 's and the Bluestone business was booming, adding to the prosperity of the village. Two of the quarries were the most productive in the entire United States and they were both owned by the F. G. Clarke Blue Stone Company.
Part of the success of the bluestone business was due to the close proximity of a transportation method utilizing the Chenango Canal. The tremendous weight of the stones, approximately 9 to 14 tons each, could not be handled by horse drawn carts or riverboats for any long distance, but the canal could handle any payload.
The stones still had to be transported from the quarries to the canal by horse teams and a heavy "truckwagon". The horses had to haul as much as 15 tons of stone down the street, past LaFayette Park, across the bridge, and up on Fort Hill, which might have taken two days to aocomplish. Sometimes as many

as 12 horses had to employed, which became a way of measuring the stone, by "horse power", not by the ton.
The stone, popular at that time, was used for sidewalks, curbs, and architectural elements. The stones were huge, heavy blocks or slabs, known as "platform stone" sometimes 12 inches thick
by 16 feet square.
When the canal was no longer in use, special railroad cars were designed to hold the stones upright on their edges. About a dozen of these stones were transported to New York City for the Vanderbilt Family Mansion to be used for their sidewalks. They had an estimated value of $\$ 10,000.00$ way back then!
The F.G. Clarke Blue Stone Company had about 300 employees, many were immigrants from Ireland and Germany, but the majority of laborers were from Lipari, Italy. The company took contracts for cut stone for buildings "dressed ", which means they were cut, trimmed to size and polished on one side, ready to set in place.
One fine example of bluestone work in Oxford still stands. It originally was the First National Bank of Oxford, built in 1894, and now houses the Town and Village Hell.
Oxford bluestone was shipped throughout the Northeast providing sidewalks and curbing for the cities of Boston, New York and Philadelphia. Thirty railroad cars of bluestone were required for the steps of the Capital building in Albany, and Oxford bluestone was used for the construction of Grant's tomb. Times Square and Rockefeller Square in New York City, are also graced with bluestone from Oxford.
The bluestone business slacked off after WWI with the invention of Portland Cement, and then the stock market crash destroyed. any plans for new construction. By the 1930's it was the end of a grand era. One of the quarries reopened in the mid-1980's, providing bluestone for patios, fireplaces, and garden walkways but business would never be the same as the century before. Today the beauty of bluestone sits quietly as a legacy, especially evident in the town that made it great.
The photograph shows several undressed slabs which are stacked and ready for dressing and shipping. The four men in the center of the photo portray the grand size of the bluestone.


## Greek Revival Style Bandstand Built in LaFayette Park

The Bandstand, located in the middle of Oxford in LaFayette Park, was designed by James Edward and was constructed by Fred and Bernard Tracy in the Greek Pevival Style.

On May 30, 1916, before a very large gathering of town's people, the new Bandstand was dedicated by the Citizen Band and the Ladies Village Improvement Society.

The Bandstand is kept in magnificent condition and continues to be used today by The Community Band that performs there during the summer months on Thursday evenings.

Since 1978 the small town of Oxford has had a Public Swimming Facility The Oxford Swimming Pool and Bath House were dedicated to Oxford's Youth by the Oxford Recreation Association, The Town and Village Boards of Oxford, and The Citizens of the Community. Accompanying the Pool is a Pienic Pavilion that was donated by The Oxford Rotary Club and constructed in a Southwestern Style. This provides a shaded place for family and freends to relax and eat during their summer days spent at he pool.

In 2008 the pool's 30 year old feeder pumps, electrical system
and the concrete surface were refurbished.
The pool offers swimming lessons each year to our resident children and is a popular place for people in town to cool off during the hot summer days!


We're The Oxford Blackhawks!

The Blackhawk is an icon of the entire Oxford community and the mascot of our school, however, few people may know just how this mascot was chosen.

In 1942, the high school students created a list of suggestions for a school mascot to be chosen from. On October 22 of that same year, the students voted and the Blackhawk was chosen to represent the school. It is thought to have been named after Chief Blackhawk (Ma-Ka-Tai-Me-She-Kia-Kiak or Black Sparrow Hawk) who lived from 1767-1838. He was a leader and warrior of the Sauk American Indian Tribe located in the lowa region. He fought on the side of the English in the war of 1812, and his most notable battle was when he lead an ambush on Missouri Soldiers at the Battle of Sink Hole.

After which, this particular war chief was paraded around various townships and his story was well known. His iconic red and black war paint are now the school colors, with his heroism representing the Oxford School District ever since.


# The National Bank of Oxford - Another Oxford Icon by Elisabeth Gonsales 

Isaac' Perry was New York State's premier architect who designed The National Bank Building that sits in the heart of the Village of Oxford. On the corner of NYS Route 12 and State Street, it is a three story brick and Oxford bluestone building with a conical tower, large rock faced stone masonry, and impressive round arches using the Richardsonian Romanesque Style.

This grand building was built in 1894, and stands today in testimony to. Architect Isaac Perry who also designed the New York State Capitol in Albany and many other public structures and armories.

## The New York State Veterans' Home <br> by Oetavia Bishop. Mr. Fred Lanfear ana Ms. Joni Eaton

In the 1890s the Women's Relief Corps (WRC) ap: pealed to the New York State Legislature, to provide funds for the building of a retirement home for Veterans of War, to which they could also bring their wives. Before this time, Veterans could go to NewYork State Soldiers and Sailors Home in Bath, New York, but they could not bring their wives with them.

The 60 acre site chosen to build the Women's Relief Corps Home was located in the village of Oxford, New York, and was opened on April 19, 1897. 24 residents were immediately admitted.

In 1911 the WRC Home was expanded to five buildings consisting of four cottages and one infirmary. At this time there were 172 residents, consisting of veterans from the Civil War, the Spanish American War and World War I.
In 1931 a wing was added to the skilled nursing facility.

In 1971 the WRC home was transferred from the New York State Department of Social
Services to the Department of Health. The buildings no longer met the health and safety requirements, because they were built of wood. In 1972, the State Legislature approved funds to develop plans for a new facility.

The influx of World War II veterans, mostly males, brought about the building of a large one-story building, and the old buildings were completely razed.
The new home for veterans was opened in May of 1981. From this point forward, the facility was called The New York State Veteran's Home.

In 2010 a new multi-story complex was constructed to replace the 1981 building.

It is now billed as a nursing home and offers medical, nursing, rehabilitative and psychosocial services for eligible veterans. It has the capacity for 242 residents and a staff of $350-400$ employees.

## The Oxford Memorial Library <br> by Marisa Baldwin and Ms. Joni Eaton

The Oxford Memorial Library was originally built as a priyate residence by Theodore Burr in 1811. Theodore Burr, a master craftsman in woodworking, came to Oxford in 1792 from Connecticut. By 1794 he had built a Grist Mill on the Chenango River and dam to power the mill. In 1800 he built the first stringer bridge over the Chenango River in Oxford.

From 1809 through 1811 he buile an impressive Federal Style house for his wife and'seven children on the site of an ancient Tuscaroran Indian Fort, in the area known as Fort Hill. After successfully building 45 bridges all over New York State, hê became known as the "Father of American Bridge Building." He and his family moved to Pennsylvania in 1818.

Ira Wilcox, an Oxford Merchant next purchased the house, and lived there until 1873. From 1873 until 1890, Benjamin Cannon, a Lawyer owned the house.

From 1890 until 1899 the house served as a Rectory for St . Joseph's Catholic Chürch.

In 1900 the house with its grounds, was dedicated as a Free Library in memory of Eli Lyon Corbin and his wife, Abigail Tainter Corbin, by their children. Since then, the Library has been open to the public, with strong community support and generous donations made for renovations over the years.

## Cole Memorial Fountain by Tiatira Quintana

The Fountain located in Lafayette Park is called the Cole Memorial Fountain. It was given to the Village of $\Theta x f o r d$ as a gift from Augustus, John Calvin and Henry Clay Cole in toving memory of their parents, Calvin and Fayette Cole.

The dedication and presentation was held on the night of July 17, 1884. For this occasion Lafayette Park was lit with Chinese Lanterns, and the hotels and businesses were all brilliantly lighted and decorated.



[^0]:    In 1914, The McDonough Union School was built on "Great Plot 62" now known as "The MoDonough Park. "The cost to build the four room school house then was $\$ 4,800.00$.
    The first teachers were John C. Hayes and Gertrude Lidell offering an education up to the middle school level. If students wished to have a high school education they had to travel to Oxford, Norwich and other larger towns.
    Beginning in 1921, and for many years thereafter, the school housed all grade levels through high school. However, the population began to decrease in McDonough and the idea of total consolidation with Oxford Academy was raised. This did occur in 1964.
    After the school was closed, it was used for various purposes. Some community members thought it should be used as a museum. However, in the late 1960 s the contents and the school building were sold at auction. eventually the buttding was torn down, but the bell was saved. Today the bell sits proudly atop the pavilion at McDonough Park.
