






THE 2016 OXFORD HIGH SCHOOL YEARBOOK IS DEDICATED IN LOVING MEMORY TO LEWIS H. "LEW" FORD. LEW WAS A LIFELONG RESIDENT OF THE MCDONOUGH/OXFORD AREA HAVING ATTENDED AND GRADUATED FROM OXFORD SCHOOLS. IT WAS DURING HIS TIME IN HIGH SCHOOL WHERE LEW BEGAN TO VOLUNTEER IN THE AUDIO-VISUAL DEPARTMENT, SOMETHING HE WOULD CONTINUE TO DO THROUGHOUT HIS ADULTHOOD, UNTIL HIS PASSING. AFTER ATTENDING PURDUE UNIVERSITY, LEW WAS GRADUATED FROM UTICA COLLEGE OF SYRACUSE UNIVERSITY IN 1975. IT WAS HERE THAT LEW BECAME A MEMBER OF A SERVICE FRATERNITY, ALPHA PHI OMEGA, AND FURTHER DEVELOPED THE BELIEF THAT ONE SHOULD SHARE ONE'S TALENTS WITH OTHERS. WHEN LEW RETURNED TO OXFORD, HE DID JUST THAT. HE RETURNED TO VOLUNTEERING HIS TIME IN THE OXFORD SCHOOL DISTRICT IN MANY ROLES. HE OPERATED THE SOUND SYSTEM FOR SCHOOL PLAYS, CONCERTS, AND COMMUNITY EVENTS. HE RAN THE TIME CLOCK FOR FOOTBALL AND BASKETBALL GAMES. LEW SERVED ON THE BOARD OF EDUCATION IN OXFORD, SEVERAL YEARS AS THE PRESIDENT. HE WAS ALSO A MEMBER OF THE CHENANGO COUNTY SCHOOL BOARDS ASSOCIATION. LEW WAS INVOLVED IN MANY ORGANIZATIONS OUTSIDE OF SCHOOL AS WELL. HE HAD BEEN A PART OF THE MCDONOUGH FIRE DEPARTMENT, MCDONOUGH BOARD OF FIRE COMMISSIONERS, A MEMBER OF CALVARY EPISCOPAL CHURCH IN MCDONOUGH AND ST. PAUL'S EPISCOPAL CHURCH IN OXFORD. A TALENTED BRASS PLAYER, HAVING LEARNED TO PLAY WHILE A STUDENT AT OXFORD SCHOOLS, LEW PLAYED IN THE OXFORD COMMUNITY BAND, WAS A MEMBER OF THE MID-YORK SHINING BRASS BAND, AND A FOUNDING MEMBER OF THE MID-YORK CONCERT BAND. OCCASIONALLY, HE COULD BE FOUND PLAYING WITH EITHER THE SMYRNA OR NORWICH COMMUNITY BANDS, OR SINGING WITH THE SHERBURNE COMMUNITY CHORUS. LEW WAS, AT ONE TIME, INVOLVED IN OXFORD LIONS CLUB, SERVING AS SECRETARY/TREASURER AND ALSO ASSISTED WITH THE NEW YORK STATE LIONS YOUTH BAND. THROUGHOUT HIS LIFE, LEW WOULD HAVE MANY ACCOMPLISHMENTS, NONE MORE DESERVING THAN THE DANIEL MARSHMAN AWARD. LEW RECEIVED THIS AWARD FOR BEING INSTRUMENTAL IN BRINGING THE YELLOW RIBBON PROGRAM, A SUICIDE PREVENTION PROGRAM, TO THE COMPONENT SCHOOLS OF DCMO BOCES. THIS PROGRAM WAS AVAILABLE TO ALL SCHOOLS AFFILIATED WITH THE DCMO BOCES WHERE LEW WAS EMPLOYED AS PART OF THE HEALTH AND SAFETY OFFICE. LEW ENJOYED HELPING THE SCHOOL DISTRICTS WITH BUILDING AND SAFETY NEEDS, BUT HIS GREATEST ENJOYMENT CAME FROM TIME SPENT WITH HIS WIFE JANE, HIS SONS, JOHN AND NATHANIAL, AND THE "GRANDS," HIS MANY NIECES AND NEPHEWS FOR WHOM HE HAD A SPECIAL FONDNESS. LEW'S PASSING HAS LEFT A VOID IN OUR BUILDING, AND HE SHALL BE MISSED BY US ALL.

HODGES BEGAN ON APRIL 28TH. GROUPS IN FAVOR OF SAME-SEX MARRIAGE ALL CAME TOGETHER AND ARGUED AGAINST THEIR STATE AGENCIES. THE GROUPS ARGUED THAT THEIR FOURTEENTH AMENDMENT RIGHTS WERE VIOLATED. THE FOURTEENTH AMENDMENT DEFINES CITIZENSHIP AND DUE PROCESS. BASICALLY IN THIS DAY IN AGE, IT MEANS THAT ALL PEOPLE ARE EQUAL AND ONE. THE SAME-SEX GROUPS ARGUED THAT THE EQUAL PROTECTION CLAUSE SHOULD LET THEM MARRY WHOMEVER THEY WANT AND WHEREVER THEY WANT. SOME STATES ARE ALREADY LEGALIZED, SO IT WAS DOWN TO OHIO, MICHIGAN, TENNESSEE AND KENTUCKY TO CHANGE THEIR LAWS. THIS DAY WILL GO DOWN IN HISTORY AND WILL CHANGE THE LIVES OF MANY, JUST LIKE THE CASE LOVING VS. VIRGINIA, A BATTLE FOR INTERRACIAL MARRIAGE.

CORRECTIONS OFFICERS, FEDERAL AGENTS AND LOCAL OFFICERS SEARCHED FOR THEM. RICHARD MATT WAS SHOT AND KILLED BY A FEDERAL AGENT ON JUNE 26TH WHEN HE REFUSED TO DROP A SHOTGUN. TWO DAYS LATER, A STATE POLICE SERGEANT SHOT MR. SWEAT WHEN HE REFUSED TO STOP RUNNING. - LEAH KARN
