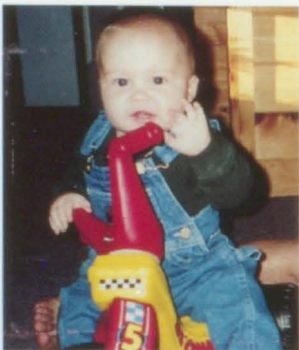
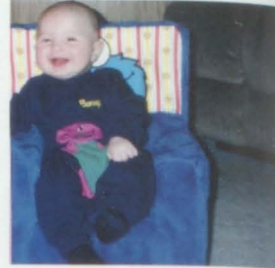
Future Plans: Attend my # 1 school, major in International Relations, and travel the world.

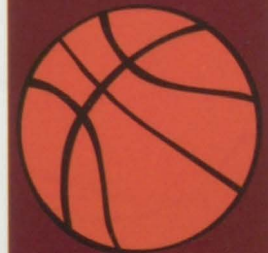

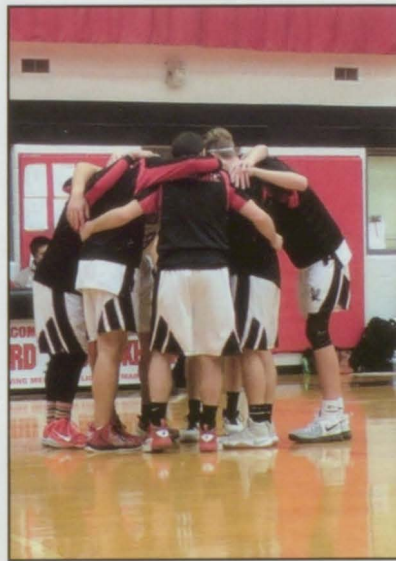

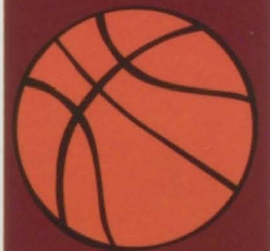

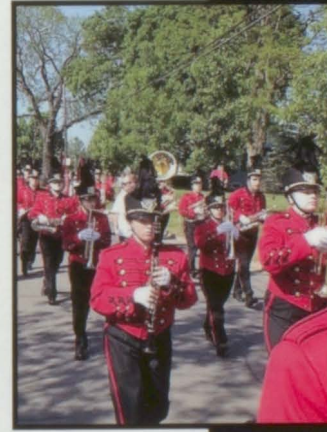

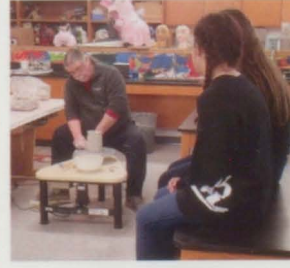
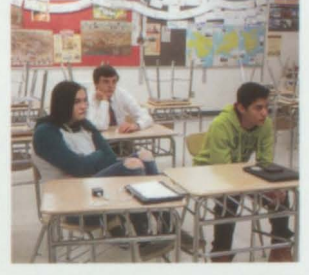
Career Day at OAHS
